Census Day

Next Thursday, 17th January 2019, is a National School Census Day. This is when the Department for Education (DfE) collects information about each school to help plan the future and, most importantly, the data is used to set future school budgets. One of the figures we report on is the number of Reception and Years 1 & 2 children who are having a Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) on this day.

We therefore ask for every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to try the hot meal on Census Day. Then your child will receive the funding for the rest of the year. If no meal is taken on Census Day then the school has to pay from the budget for future meals taken. Thank you for your anticipated co-operation.
