

Strategies for Developing Oracy in Geography

	Purpose and Impact
Defending Conclusions Reached	By defending conclusions, using given sentence stems, students think more critically about the interconnectivity between diverse people, places and environments. Within geography, we insist that evidence is used to make geographical claims. Through our oracy progression, given sentence stems are used to promote independent justification.
Group Discussion	The purpose of group discussion is to inspire curiosity and fascination so that students know more about geographical communities and circumstances.
Self-Reflection	Through the oracy progression, students are invited to change their mind based on what they have heard. In doing so, pupils develop their perspective and judgement of given geographical evidence.
Directional Language	Students are expected to use age appropriate directional language as a means to evaluate fieldwork. In doing so, students are expected to use a range of resources such as aerial photographs, OS maps, grid referencing and digital technologies.
Pose Questions, Predict and Raise Doubts	By asking students to pose further questions to their peers, students evidence an understanding of geographical enquiry, placing themselves at the heart of their own investigation.
Describing Given Places	Within Geography, students are expected to describe given places through specific geographical vocabulary. In doing so, students are expected to use comparative phrases to highlight similarities and differences between known places and those presented.
