



## Strategies for Developing Oracy in French

	Purpose and Impact
<b>Defending Conclusions</b>	By defending conclusions, using given sentence stems, students think more critically about pronunciation, intonation, punctuation and vocabulary used. In doing so, students show a greater understanding of the French language.
<b>Group Discussion</b>	The purpose of group discussion is to inspire curiosity so that students have a greater fascination about the language and country studied implementing cultural capital.
<b>Self-reflection</b>	Through the oracy progression, students are invited to change their mind based on what they have heard. In doing so, pupils develop their perspective and judgement of given historical evidence.
<b>Active Listening</b>	Within French, students are expected to listen attentively to spoken language, from a range of people and sources, and show understanding by joining in and responding by using their knowledge of the French language.
<b>Engaging in conversation, tonal experimentation and practicing pronunciation.</b>	Within French, students are given a range of opportunities to verbally experiment with the French language. In doing so, students aim to speak with increasing confidence, fluency and spontaneity.
