Thank you for your understanding in following the changes we needed to make to our routines to be able to open fully. Please continue to help by sticking with your child's drop off and collection time – this allows for a safe arrival and departure, which is even more important following the government's announcements this week. Also remember it should be **one adult** per child to reduce footfall in the school.

Thank you also for all the learning your child achieved in the time they were away from school. It is clear that lots of time has been well spent with reading and other educational activities.

Thank you for the positive comments and feedback given about the return to school this week. Your knowledge of the situation and the dedication of our staff to create a welcoming and positive atmosphere despite the current situation is very much appreciated. All our staff have been fantastic in adapting to our new timetables, many volunteering extra time before, during and after the 'normal' school day hours.

Finally, thank you for the trust and confidence you have shown in returning your child to our school. We are constantly balancing the guidance being issued with common sense to continue to ensure that our children Smile – Learn – Excel at SLE.

<u>School Update</u>

As mentioned, we have enjoyed our first week of the new year. We remain positive about remaining fully operational throughout September and beyond, however, we must remain aware of the changeability of the situation. We must remain vigilant with the health of our children and adults. A localized case or small cluster outbreak at school could result in certain/all classes being temporarily closed. Please help us by ensuring that **we have your most up to date contact numbers** should we need to contact you urgently. We have plans in place to isolate a child (or adult) should they exhibit any symptom linked with the coronavirus, but obviously the quicker they are collected, tested and treated the better. Thank you for your continued understanding and patience.

All the children have settled back into their classes extremely naturally. Next week will see the children in Year 2 taught together for maths and science. This will also occur with children in Year 5. There are staggered playtimes in place which only allow for a consistent two classes to be on the playground at any time, whilst the staggered lunch timetable allows for cleaning between sittings in the hall, and has been accepted by the children without any fuss or upset.

Miss Oxenham Badge

Children today have been sent home with a special Miss O badge. These were designed in connection with the children last year and are a way in which we can remember Miss Oxenham and the inspiration and love she gave all the children at SLE. Last year's Year 6 children were presented with their badge before they moved on to secondary school. The badges can be worn to school or kept safely as a memento of a wonderful teacher and human being. Class One will receive their badges next week.

<u>Snacks</u>

Due to the changes required to safely operate playtimes and staggered lunches, the morning session is slightly longer for some of our children, and this is making them a little hungry. Please could you provide a healthy snack for your child, especially if they are in Year 3,4,5 or 6. Reception, Year 1 and 2 children currently receive a free piece of fruit a day under the government scheme.

Sports Hoodies

One of our parents, Mrs Whitfeld has very kindly offered to look to source PE hoodies for our children complete with the school logo. These would not replace the school sweatshirt, but would be ideal to be worn to school on current PE days, especially with Autmn and Winter approaching. There would be a cost for each hoodie, which is currently expected to be around £10, it may work out slighter cheaper or higher depending on the number ordered.
